SUMMARY OF REPORT:

Council recently advertised its intention to name the section of road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point, seeking submissions for suitable names.

The following suitable names, in compliance with Council's Policy on Naming of Streets and Roads were submitted;

1. Barneys Point Drive
2. Tweed River Esplanade

Several Aboriginal names were also submitted and consideration of these names was sought through the Tweed Byron Local Aboriginal Land Council. Unfortunately no response was received from them consenting to their use.

The local area is historically known as "Barneys Point" and in keeping with the historical significance of the name it would be appropriate to call the road "Barneys Point Drive".

It is recommended that Council advertise its intention to name the road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point as "Barneys Point Drive" allowing one month for submissions or objections to the proposal.

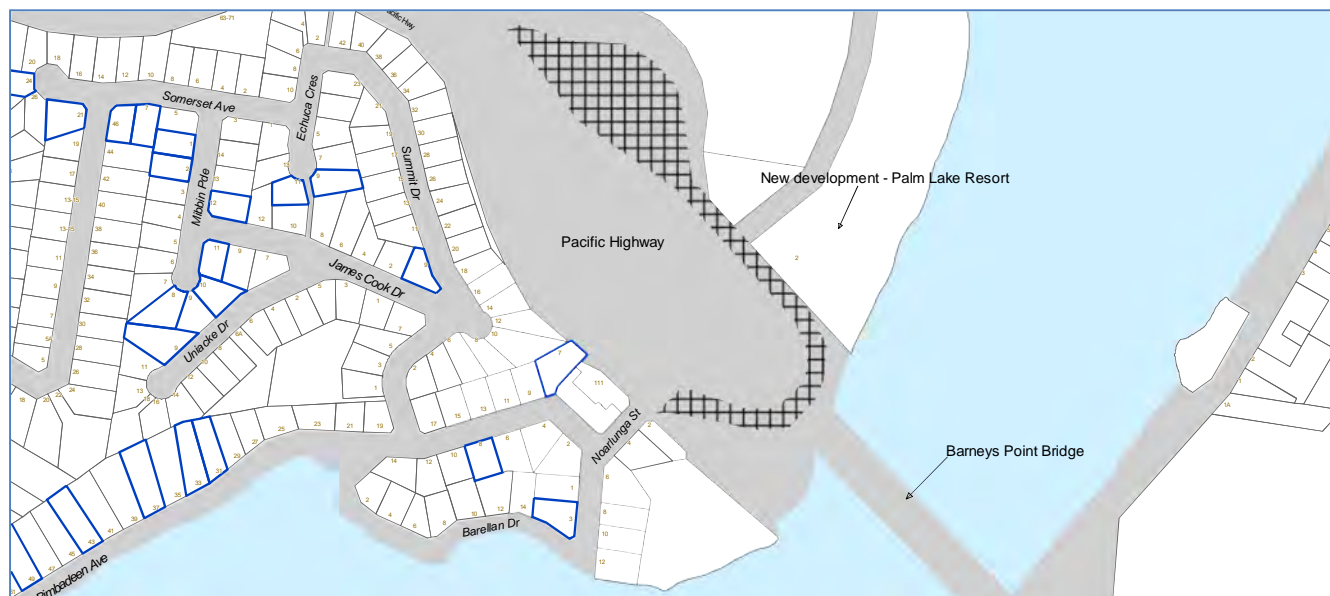
RECOMMENDATION:**That:**

1. **ATTACHMENT 1 is CONFIDENTIAL in accordance with Section 10A(2) of the Local Government Act 1993, because it contains:-**
 - (a) **personnel matters concerning particular individuals (other than councillors).**
2. **Council publicises its intention to name the road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point as "Barneys Point Drive" allowing one month for submissions or objections to the proposal; and**
3. **Council notifies the relevant authorities under the provisions of the Roads and Council (General) Regulation 2008.**

REPORT:

Council recently advertised its intention to name the section of road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point, seeking submissions for suitable names.

Below is a plan showing the location of the road reserve to be named. It is located off the Pacific Highway at the Barneys Point exit.



The following suitable names, in compliance with Council's Policy on Naming of Streets and Roads, were submitted;

1. Barneys Point Drive
2. Tweed River Esplanade

Several Aboriginal names were also submitted as follows;

- Coweolonga - Kurna word meaning 'water'
- Akuna - Aboriginal word meaning 'flowing water'
- Banyandah - Aboriginal word meaning 'beautiful view'
- Omaroo - Aboriginal word meaning 'home on the water'
- Warrunga - Aboriginal word meaning 'good view'
- Yaringa - Aboriginal word meaning 'near the sea'

These names were submitted to the Tweed Byron Local Aboriginal Land Council for consideration however no response was received from them consenting to their use.

The local area is historically known as 'Barneys Point' and in keeping with the historical significance of the name, it would be appropriate to call the road "Barneys Point Drive".

It is recommended that Council advertise its intention to name the road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point as "Barneys Point Drive" allowing one month for submissions or objections to the proposal.

OPTIONS:

1. Council advertise its intention to name the road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point;
 - a) as Barneys Point Drive, or
 - b) as Tweed River Esplanade, or
2. Council re-advertises its intention to name the road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point seeking further submissions for acceptable names.

CONCLUSION:

It is recommended that Council advertise its intention to name the road running south then north from the Noarlunga Street intersection at Banora Point as "Barneys Point Drive" allowing one month for submissions or objections to the proposal.
