Responding to high priority road hazards caused by weather events

Fast fact

During wet weather, Council prioritises community safety first. We address life-threatening risks first and target urgent maintenance on our busiest roads and areas where people are isolated.

Check the road conditions

Look out for pedestrians and cyclists

They may be hard to see in the rain.

Keep your distance

Allow for additional gap between you and the vehicle in front.

Stay alert

Turn your headlights on, keep your eyes on the road and pay attention to vehicles around you.

Slow down

The posted speed limit is the maximum speed under ideal conditions. It's safer to drive below the limit in wet conditions.

If it's flooded, forget it!

Never drive through floodwaters. Floodwaters can hide dangerous debris and road damage. Modern cars can float in shallow water and their electronic systems are easily damaged if submerged. Most flood-related deaths are caused by people driving into floodwaters.

Drive to the road conditions

Avoid unnecessary travel during heavy rain events, allow extra time and adjust your driving to the weather and road conditions.

Did you know?

Permanent, large scale road repairs cannot be done in the rain. Dry conditions are needed to properly compact our pavement gravels and for bitumen surfaces to properly harden. We also need to make sure workers and road users are safe when we conduct roadworks.
