In the absence of a quorum, the meeting proceeded as a discussion with notes being taken. It was noted that the AAC would not be able to make any recommendations/ resolutions unless a quorum was achieved.

Business suspended for Item A2.

#### A2. Dance and Song Project LOS (Gary Kafoa and Aubrey Cora)

Gary Kafoa and Aubrey Cora were advised that the AAC were not able to make any recommendation as there is no quorum.

Cr Byrnes arrived at 10.15am

Quorum achieved at 10.15am.

Leweena Williams arrived at 10.20am

Robert advised the AAC that Gary and Aubrey are attending the meeting to advise the AAC of a dance-based project they are involved in which is being managed by Arts Northern Rivers. Council was approached to provide a letter of support for the project however that request was declined until the AAC was consulted.

Aubrey tabled a copy of the project proposal and advised that the funding submission has already been lodged.

The AAC noted the project and asked to be kept informed of the outcome of the funding and for longer term projects updates. The purpose of today's presentation is by way of informing the AAC of the project. No recommendation or resolution is required from the AAC.

Aubrey Kafoa and Gary Cora left the meeting at 10.32am

Robert introduced Cr Byrnes to the AAC and welcomed him to the meeting.

Des Williams opened the meeting with a welcome to all present and paid respect to Elders past and present.

Robert advised that he has emailed a copy of the brief to the AAC. The AAC advised that they would also like to be provided with a hard copy.

#### 2. Committee Governance

Jackie advised that she and Glenda Nalder have signed the Member acknowledgement of Council's Code of Conduct on behalf of the Tweed Wollumbin Aboriginal Education Consultative Group and returned the signed copies to Council at today's AAC meeting.

#### 3. Principles of Local Government

The Principles of Local Government document was tabled and handed out to the AAC.

#### Terms of Reference

Robert advised that he hasn't heard back from Bugalwena. Robert will be having a meeting at Bugalwena next week. Leweena suggested that Bugalwena Aboriginal Health Advisory Committee be approached and that they are having a meeting next week. The contact at Bugalwena Advisory Committee is Peter Honeyman.

Business Suspended for Item A4.

Adrian Piper, Dale Scotcher, Boyd Sergeant arrived at 10.38am

A4. DA17/0102 40 Creek Street, Hastings Point - Joanne Kay (Tweed Shire Council) Jo advised that there has been a long history of development proposals at Lot 156 DP 628026 40 Creek Street, Hastings Point and the current proposal is for a 17 lot community title subdivision. Jo noted that the AAC was previously consulted during the initial Cultural Heritage Assessment dated February 2010 prepared by Everick for DA 15/0201 that has not been determined. Everick has now provided a statement of currency of the Cultural Heritage Assessment for this amended application. Jo advised Council has sought feedback from the Office of Environment and Heritage and has received advice back from this authority stating the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment prepared by Everick in 2010 included fieldwork undertaken in 2007 and considered the potential impacts of a proposed subdivision layout different to the current proposal.

Des Williams left the meeting at 10.55am

Leweena noted that the last site survey was carried out by Cyril Scott in 2007 and the AAC need to consider the recent Aboriginal Cultural Heritage identified in Hastings Point.

Action: CDO-Aboriginal to provide AAC with a copy of the proposal for DA17/0102, site plan and letter from OEH dated 18 April 2017.

Jo advised that the new application is a reduced footprint and that there will be some earthworks involved including introduced fill as the site is prone to flooding. Leweena advised there may be impacts downstream with that much fill coming in and asked whether it will affect Aboriginal Cultural Heritage sites within the creek or affect other cultural activities on the creek.

Leweena advised that the AAC needs to revisit the site because of the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage identified in the vicinity.

Jo advised she is seeking guidance from the AAC as to whether the assessment sufficiently addresses the new development proposal.

Cr Byrnes left the meeting at 11.27am

A5. Terranora Broadwater Sewer Replacement - Sally Cooper (Tweed Shire Council) Sally provided background of her previous attendance at the AAC and the nature of the works and inspection undertaken with TBLALC and Robert Appo. The proposed works are in close proximity to one of the middens.

Sally is seeking advice from the AAC in relation to cultural heritage so that she can report back to the engineer.

Colleen Forbes arrived at 11.30am

Sally advised that the existing trench could be excavated and then refilled as the pipe sits away from the midden and is eroding into the river. There is other cultural material along the footprint. The difficulty is how does Council upgrade the infrastructure but avoid harm to the cultural material.

Sally advised that the pipe would be a larger pipe but the engineer has advised that it should be in the first disturbance area as the head of the pipe is at the same height so there will be no extra disturbance.

Des advised that a monitor would be required on site if there is any ground disturbance to be done as it needs to be monitored.

Jackie advised that she feels that Council should be looking at how the whole area along the river can be protected into the future.

Action:

That Sally Cooper requests further advice from OEH regarding the proposed activity at the Terranora Broadwater Sewer Replacement and that the reply be provided to the Community Development Officer-Aboriginal for forwarding to the AAC.

Sally Cooper left the meeting at 11.48am

- A6. Adrian Piper (Everick)
- (b) Cobaki Cultural Parks (Boyd Sergeant and Dale Scotcher attending) and (Colleen Forbes, Tweed Shire Council attending)

Boyd advised that they are attending today as a follow up from when they last presented to the AAC.

Boyd advised that through their redesign, the Cultural Heritage Parks have now been incorporated with the open space requirements and that the lots that were close to the cultural heritage area have now been removed. Boyd tabled some plans outlining the proposal.

Colleen requested that a workshop be held with all the stakeholders in relation to the Cultural Parks rather than it being discussed at the AAC. Council will be providing feedback to Leda and Planit in relation to open space and the Cultural Heritage Parks which may alter the design. A copy of the plans could be provided to each of the stakeholders at a future workshop.

Des advised that the AAC appreciates the updates. The AAC will go along with Colleen's suggestion that a workshop be held.

Dale Scotcher and Boyd Sergeant left the meeting at 12pm

(a) Cobaki Waste Water Treatment Plant (Colleen Forbes, Tweed Shire Council attending)

Adrian advised that Everick did not provide him with a copy of the Cultural Assessment for this project so he has printed out a google map and plan of the site. The area concerned is on Piggabeen Road near the golf driving range, with the golf driving range being the site for the WWTP.

Warren Phillips and Adrian did a site visit in October 2016. Adrian advised that no Cultural Heritage was found during the survey and that the site has been quite disturbed and it was unlikely that any cultural material would be present within the development area.

Adrian asked whether the AAC has any issues with the proposal.

Colleen provided some advice in relation to the developer connecting to its own sewerage system rather than using Council's sewerage system.

Action:

Colleen to provide to CDO-Aboriginal the link to the IPART website for the Licence Application for on-forwarding to the AAC members who may wish to make a submission in relation to the proposal. Submissions close on 24 May.

Colleen Forbes left the meeting at 12.21pm

(c) 57 Crabbes Creek Road, Crabbes Creek Adrian tabled the Cultural Heritage Assessment for 57 Crabbes Creek Road, Crabbes Creek prepared by Everick and dated February 2017. Adrian provided an overview of the proposal and advised that the property owner is looking at building five dwellings in three areas as a 'shared development' arrangement. There is already a farmhouse and associated sheds on the property.

Adrian advised that he carried out a site inspection with Travis McDermott from the Local Aboriginal Land Council. The proposed development will not directly impact on the high ridge. Des attended a site inspection with Adrian and advised there is potential for a camp site in Zone 1 and the water run-off lends itself to the belief there were freshwater holes throughout the property. Des advised there are no bora rings or anything that is of high cultural significance, just the potential for a campsite. The applicant is looking at building two dwellings in Zone 1 with Adrian providing a copy of the plan for the dwellings which will be on piers. Des advised that he would like to be present for any land-scraping or excavation as there is a high possibility of artefacts just under the ground surface.

The AAC advised that Recommendation 1 in Everick's Cultural Heritage Assessment dated February 2017 fully sets out the AAC's requirements regarding site monitoring.

#### (d) 166 Chinderah Bay Drive, Chinderah

Adrian tabled the Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment for 166 Chinderah Bay Drive, Chinderah prepared by Everick and dated May 2017. The proposed development is for a café and shop-top residence.

During investigations a site survey was undertaken with TBLALC and Jackie McDonald. There was no evidence in the form of disturbed surface scatter of shell or other cultural materials identified.

#### (e) 23 Tweed Coast Road, Hastings Point

Adrian tabled the Project Information Booklet for 23 Tweed Coast Road, Hastings Point prepared by Everick dated May 2016 and advised that Everick will be undertaking an assessment in the near future to consider the potential impacts of the project on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage.

#### (f) Kings Forest

Adrian Piper left the meeting at 12.46pm

Chantelle tabled the draft Cultural Plan and provided an update on the themes set out in the Plan and requested feedback from the AAC.

Leweena suggested that Tweed Shire is a 'green' shire and the community has fought for the uniqueness of the shire. The community does not want to be seen as a 'Gold Coast'.

Jackie suggested that on page 9 the heading be updated to read: 'Bundjalung Jugun - Bundjalung Country'.
