# Murwillumbah CBD to get a splash of colour

Pop-up seating and planters painted by local artists are set to be installed across Murwillumbah CBD as part of a short-term project to enhance street vibrancy, pedestrian amenity and to increase activity to support local businesses.

Eight cylinder-shaped art seats and planters are due to be installed in central Murwillumbah next week.

Artists including Jason King, Mealie Batchelor, Judy Oakenfull, Mitch Schultz, Philip Hay and Cam Scale have been busy preparing the seating at MIArts Precinct in the town.

The seats will be located on the corner of Murwillumbah and Brisbane Streets, as well as on the north and south side of the central pedestrian crossing on Murwillumbah Street.

As part of the Tweed Green Parklet, Public Art and Activation project,

two temporary parklets will also be installed in the town during November. Located in front of the BGF Building in Queen Street and in front of MIArts in Brisbane Street, the parklets will incorporate seating, greenery and interactive spaces to enhance street appeal.

Weather permitting, the first parklet will be installed next week in

Minor traffic disruption is expected during the installation.

The project is supported by the NSW Government's Streets as Shared Spaces initiative.

# **COVID-19** exemption for **Remembrance Day**

- have a COVID-19 Safety Plan in place.

The exception will be in place for services held before Thursday 2 November 2020.

### Final auditorium works underway

Work has commenced on the final stage of the Murwillumbah Civic Centre auditorium.

The upgrade of the auditorium will see the closure of the vehicle ramp in front of the Civic Centre until the end of January 2021, including the accessible parking bays.

A new accessible parking area has been established for use near the base of the pedestrian ramp in the existing bus parking area, in addition to the accessible parking bays under the building and at

Pedestrian access to the civic centre will be via the front stairs at reception and the ramp adjacent to these stairs.

The small ramp and stairs in front of the auditorium entrance will be closed until works are complete.

Work on the auditorium, built in 1974, will include technical upgrades to sound and lighting equipment and refurbishment of the foyer.

There is much to consider when it comes to funerals. Early planning can help ease the strain and ensure your family understands your wishes. Here are some of the things you'll need to think about:


- For a burial, you'll need a plot and a coffin (the coffin can be made from a number of different materials – cardboard is fine)
