January holds a special place in the heart of Murwillumbah tennis coach Gemma Eaton.

Apart from it being the month for the Australian Open, it is when Australia Day is celebrated. As the Tweed Shire Australia Day Ambassador 2022, Gemma is excited about welcoming new award winners and also new citizens on 26 January.

As the recipient of the 2020 Sporting Achievement Award, Gemma is passionate about her sport, encouraging people of all ages to have a go as well as helping to develop our next generation of champions.

"COVID has had such an impact on our lives and for many, it has disrupted our sporting interests," Gemma said.

"As a tennis player and coach, I have been fortunate that the pandemic hasn't had such a major effect - you have plenty of separation on the tennis court, even when you are playing doubles.

"Tennis has a very strong social element and we encourage that at the Murwillumbah Tennis Club.

"There's a sense of community and that is very important whether you belong to a sporting or social club.

"I know there are many people in the community helping others get through these tough times. As the Tweed Shire Australia Day Ambassador, I encourage anyone who knows someone who is making a contribution or helping others to nominate them for a Tweed Australia Day award.

"Since receiving my award, I have had many people congratulate me. The award has also helped me to raise awareness of helping people with disability take to the courts and providing opportunities for seniors to get out and get active on our courts.'

The club has recently installed new competition surfaces on a couple of its courts and has also improved accessibility for people with disability to enjoy forms of tennis, particularly Pickleball which is played on half of a regular tennis court.

Gemma said she views January as a month of bringing people together and recognising achievements and efforts.

"In tennis we have champions on the courts like Ash Barty who is inspiring so many girls and women into the sport and Dylan Alcott who is showing that a disability is no obstacle to unbelievable performances," she said.

"The Australia Day Awards are similar in that they allow us to recognise the champions in our community who are doing things that are inspirational as well.

"They deserve to be honoured so if you know someone who was doing something amazing on the Tweed for the community in 2021, please nominate them and let their efforts be acknowledged on 26 January."

Council facilities temporarily closed

Council has temporarily close a number of its facilities and services in keeping with the NSW Government's latest COVID-19 restrictions for the Tweed local government area (LGA).

Stay-at-home orders were introduced for the Tweed and Byron LGAs from 5pm on Tuesday for seven days due to an increased COVID-19 public health risk. These stay-at-home orders also apply to anyone who has been in the Tweed or Byron LGAs since 18 September.

- As a result, Council has shut its customer-facing facilities including:
- Customer Service Counters at Murwillumbah and Tweed Heads • Tweed Regional Aquatic Centres
- Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Art Centre
- Tweed Regional Museum
- · Library branches at Murwillumbah, Tweed Heads and Kingscliff · Starting Block Café at TRAC Murwillumbah only open for
- takeaway meals and beverages · Tweed Holiday Parks, with some exceptions, including for permanent residents, overnight travellers, persons working in the local area, persons who have no other place of permanent residence
- Tweed JUNKtion Tip Shop (remains closed)
- Visitor Information Centres · Council events
- · Council-approved community markets, including at Kingscliff,

SALT Village, Pottsville, Murwillumbah and Tweed Heads (unless approval to modify is sought and granted).

Essential services including water and kerbside waste collection services will operate as normal. Stotts Creek Resource Recovery Centre (the tip) is open to people permitted under the Public Health Order to use it. Visitors must observe COVID Safe practices such as masks and QR check in.

Everyone in the affected LGAs must stay at home unless it is for an essential reason, which includes shopping for food, medical care, getting vaccinated, compassionate needs, exercise and work or tertiary education if you can't work or study at home.

People who are fully vaccinated can attend an outdoor gathering of up to 5 people for exercise or outdoor recreation, as long as all of those aged 16 or older are fully vaccinated.

Keeping Cats Safe at Home project

"We feel really privileged to be one of the 10 NSW councils invited to participate in the Keeping Cats Safe at Home project," Ms Gray said.

"The Keeping Cats Safe at Home project will build on the amazing work done through the Love Cats Love Wildlife project which ran for 3 years in the Tweed and was funded through the NSW Environmental Trust.'

Young talent shines in annual portrait prize

During the current COVID-19 lockdown, add some colour and creativity to your day by visiting a virtual online presentation of the annual Les Peterkin Portrait Prize on display at the Tweed Regional Gallery & Margaret Olley Arts Centre from Thursday 23 September to Sunday 28 November 2021.

The exhibition is a celebration of the enormous artistic talent and creative vision of our local primary schools.

This year the Prize attracted a high number of entries and participating schools

Working on the theme #Selfie, Primary school students sketched, collaged, photographed and painted images capturing themselves in ways that highlight their interests, life and character.

The 2021 judges were: local artists Caz McDougal and Vira Higgins; Friends of the Gallery committee members Rose Wilsher and Malcom Reid; and Tyalgum Public School representatives and retired school principals Rebecca McGuren and Peter Meadows.

"I am extremely impressed by the enormous number of entries received and the effort of every child who entered the competition," Prize Coordinator Marianne Galluzzo said,

"This year's theme set out to expand the imaginations of our aspiring young artists and allowed them to explore the form of self-expression by highlighting key moments, developments, and motivations through portraiture.

The Prize is named after legendary local artist and art teacher Les Peterkin

Each prize winner will have the thrill of seeing their artwork professionally displayed on the Gallery's walls (once lockdown ends). A further 200 outstanding works will be on display in folios for the duration of the exhibition.
