Love your Local at Kingscliff

A new 'shop local' campaign has been launched in Kingscliff, to show that the town is very much open for business while a number of infrastructure projects are underway over the next two years.

'Love Your Local at Kingscliff' is the slogan which will be prominently displayed in local shops and on shopping bags, stickers, badges and websites throughout the campaign. The initiative is a collaboration between Council and the Kingscliff and District Business Chamber.

A friendly competition between Kingscliff traders to come up with a catchy slogan was won by Lisa Smith of Amcal Chempro Chemist, whose idea 'Love Your Local at Kingscliff' was selected by the Kingscliff and District Business Chamber.

"As a small community it is important to help each other out, even if it means travelling a little further. It is vital that we don't change our shopping habits and continue to Love Your Local," Ms Smith said.

Chamber President, Don Neale, urged all Kingscliff residents - north and south – to support Kingscliff over the next two years.

"As traders, we need to offer customer friendly service more than ever at Kingscliff to encourage residents to stay loyal," Mr Neale said. The Kingscliff Bridge over Cudgen Creek will be closed until December 2016, adding a further 11 minutes to the trip from Casuarina Way, Salt Village to Marine Parade, Kingscliff.

Work on the Kingscliff Foreshore Revitalisation project along Marine Parade is set to start early in 2017, with the closure of the Kingscliff Beach Holiday Park for upgrading and the commencement of construction of a seawall. "Collaboration is essential to grasping that opportunity and at the forum we'll be hearing about some of the great ideas out there and exploring how we can work together to make the most of these opportunities.

"We will share lessons from local food initiatives, showcase local food success stories from a number of states, explore possibilities on a way forward to boost the local food economy, as well as showcasing local food, agricultural industries, food tourism and sustainable economic and community initiatives." Fish friendly information sessions for earthmoving contractors

Council invites all local earthmoving contractors to an information session where they can learn about the most important steps to protect fish and their habitat when working in or near our waterways.

The session will be presented by NSW Fisheries Department and will focus on how to protect fish, and also how to protect machinery operators from penalties that may arise from works such as unauthorised tree clearing or excavation.

"Research tells us that two out of every three Australians go fishing, so there is a high chance that earthmoving contractors fish, and that they care about protecting our waterways to maximise their chances of a good catch," Council's Waterways Program Leader, Tom Alletson, said.

The information being provided is designed to ensure that contractors can protect the environment, as well as their business. Council requires its contractors to comply with requirements on waterway protection, and as business operators servicing private clients, it's important for earthmoving contractors to know what is current best practice is, and what the rules are.

"Earthmoving contractors often find themselves working near creeks and river banks. They have the opportunity to make a positive impact on the environment, but are also at high risk of causing damage, or attracting penalties if they undertake unapproved works; even if these are instructed by a client."

The session will be held from 5.30pm - 7.30pm on Wednesday 27 July at the Canvas and Kettle Meeting Room, at the pool end of the Murwillumbah Civic Centre. Snacks will be provided and there will be a \$250 gift voucher from BCF up for grabs as a lucky door prize.

Halfway for Kennedy Drive Stage 3

Today (Tuesday 12 July) Council reaches the halfway mark in constructing Stage 3 of the Kennedy Drive upgrade in Tweed Heads West.

Council expects to temporarily seal the completed northern side of the road today before starting works on the southern side.

On Thursday, the temporary seal will be line-marked ahead of the traffic lanes being switched on Monday (18 July). One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained.

Workers will then begin work on the southern side of the road, between Cobaki Creek Bridge and Limosa Road, mirroring the work undertaken on the northern side.

When all works are completed in about 12 weeks, weather permitting, Council will then apply the permanent seal to both sides of the road.

Council thanks motorists for their continuing patience and courteousness demonstrated throughout these roadworks.

Bridge over water no trouble

Last Friday marked a milestone for the Fingal Bridge, with the laying of the beam girders which form the foundation of the bridge's deck. The precast girders were made off site - each weighing 5.2 tonnes- and were lifted in place by a 40 tonne crane. With the girders in place, work can continue to form and pour the concrete deck and concrete bridge approach slabs. Work should be completed mid to late August.

Don't get stuck on the 'flushable' claim

Since launching its "No Wipes in Our Pipes" sticker to educate residents not to flush these handy little items, Council is learning that many consumers are stuck on the 'flushable' claim.

"No wipes are 'flushable' regardless of the brand and despite any claim to the contrary made on the pack," said Water Engineer Elizabeth Seidl. "Once any wipe is flushed the potential result is the same – a blocked sewer system that has to be unblocked at great expense to the ratepayer."

A "No Wipes in Our Pipes" sticker was mailed to every Tweed water customer on the front of their last quarterly water bill envelope, asking them to stick it on the loo next to the flush button. "Since then, we have been

getting about three calls a

week from nursing homes, child care centres and holiday parks asking for more stickers, which we are happy to supply as the 'don't flush' message needs to stick," said Ms Seidl.

So far, about 1000 extra stickers have been sent out.

While the industry body Water Services Association of Australia is working with wipe manufacturers to try to overcome the misleading 'flushable' claims, Ms Seidl says consumers can test the claim themselves by filling two jars with water and placing a wipe in one and toilet tissue in the other.

"The toilet tissue breaks into small pieces immediately when shaken; the wipe holds together \ldots and it's the same story when the items are flushed out of sight."

Sewer blockages caused by wipes are estimated to be costing Australian water utilities \$15 million a year and this cost is shared by Tweed ratepayers as Council is called out up to 20 times a day to unblock a sewer here.

If the blockage is at a pump station, the pump will have worked overtime trying to shift the blockage itself. During this effort, the pump uses more electricity, risks damage and burnout and reduced life expectancy. If Council workers have to manually intervene, it takes two workers in a truck fitted with a crane at least two hours to lift the pump and remove the blockage.

"So don't get stuck on the flushability claim," said Ms Seidl. "Call Council on (02) 6670 2400 for a 'No Wipes in Our Pipes' sticker and get stuck into spreading this message."
