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Growing support for Tweed Flood Appeal

An independent committee including representatives from community services, business and farming groups is being formed to oversee the distribution of funds donated to the Mayor Appeal Fund.

In a remarkable show of support and generosity for flood-affected Tweed communities, the fund has moved well past the \$100,000 mark.

The independent committee will review applications for assistance with the priority being those people and businesses with limited access or options for insurance claims, funding or grants.

Council General Manager Troy Green said the focus will be on people who are at risk of falling through the gaps in the support system.

"One hundred per cent of this fund will be distributed to local residents and businesses affected by the floods. There are no administration fees or payments to corporate fundraising websites," he said.

"It will be an easy process for people to apply. Details of the distribution of funds will be available on our website and publicised widely when finalised." The Tweed Coast communities have shown their support through the Kingscliff 'Caravan of Love' event at the Kingscliff Hotel, which raised more than \$21,000.

Twenty thousand dollars was donated by ITV Granada, the producers of *I'm a Celebrity . . . Get Me Out of Here* (UK TV series), which is filmed outside Murwillumbah.

Many local businesses, including Dinki Di Discounts and Tropical Fruit World are digging deep to support their Tweed colleagues. Personal donations have also been received from individuals both within and outside the Tweed. Standard assistance under this package may include: one-off grants up to \$10,000 to eligible businesses and not-for-profits for clean-up and immediate reinstatement costs, or one-off exceptional circumstances grants up to \$15,000 to eligible businesses for clean-up and immediate reinstatement costs.

The first round of support includes areas around the major town centres including Murwillumbah, South Murwillumbah, Condong and Bray Park.

Other Tweed Shire areas including affected rural villages and outlying businesses are being considered under a separate application with more information soon to come.

Recovery Centre - vital to check in and register for help

In the weeks following the flood and as our community progresses through the recovery phase, it is really important to check on your family, friends, neighbours and community members and ensure anyone needing assistance is referred to the Murwillumbah Recovery Centre in Nullum Street or call them on (02) 6670 2133 during opening hours.

As of Thursday last week the centre has seen more than 980 people and businesses who have been impacted by these floods.

The Murwillumbah Recovery Centre is the single point for all flood affected residents and businesses.

While there have been many volunteer groups and other donation centres established in some villages, it is vital that anyone affected who

needs help is registered with the Recovery Centre to ensure they have access to the government agencies and various support services that will be available.

Agencies based at the Recovery Centre will include Health, Disaster Welfare, Primary Industries, Insurance Agencies, Family and Community Services, Business Connect, Legal Aid, EPA, Centrelink and Red Cross.

Centrelink will no longer be at the Recovery Centre as of Tuesday 18 April and will be operating from their usual offices at Tweed Heads and Murwillumbah.

Social surge of information during floods

Stott's Creek Resource Recovery Centre

- Council's Resource Recovery Centre at Stotts Creek has extended its free tip service until Sunday 23 April for flood affected residents.
- Please provide your driver's licence or proof of address to receive the fee waiver.
- It is important to note that the fee waiver has been implemented to assist our flood affected community in disposing of flood damaged items only.
- · There will be no further extension to the fee waiver period.

Water bills unaffected

Residents who used water to clean their properties after the floods should not fear getting a huge water bill.

"Our records of previous floods show that cleaning up after floodwaters recede does not result in a massive spike in residential water use or cost," said Manager Water and Wastewater Anthony Burnham.

Following the floods of January 2008 in Tumbulgum, Council investigated the effect of flood clean-up on residential water bills and found only one in eight properties used more water than normal and that the excess use equated to 5000 litres and cost approximately \$6. An investigation was also carried out after the January 2013 flood with similar results.

"We fully expect a similar result from the floods of the past few weeks but invite any property owner who does receive an abnormally high bill to contact us and we will consider offering relief on its merits.

"To administer an across-the-board reduction in water bills following the floods would cost more than is saved by the community.

"The Fire Brigade, which assisted in washing down roads, footpaths and public areas, tapped into Council hydrants. But if there are instances where they used water from private property, please bring that to our attention," said Mr Burnham.

Council has continued reading water meters throughout the recent emergency situation but had halted sending accounts. But, next week, the first of those post-flood accounts will be in the mail.

Majority of roads open, but caution still required

All Council roads bar two are trafficable and all communities have access in and out of their properties.

Council has successfully negotiated to push a temporary track through private property to restore access around the catastrophic failure of Manns Road at Rowlands Creek. This work will start this week.

Investigations are continuing in how to repair Lone Pine Road at Doon Doon, where one property is isolated.

This week Council will install temporary traffic lights on Clothiers Creek Road to improve safety at the one-lane section skirting a major landslip.

Council advises that while Mount Warning Road is trafficable as far as the National Parks gate and businesses there are open, the summit track is closed to visitors as repairs to scours and slip damage are being undertaken.

Road repairs will continue on Mount Warning Road over the next month as Council works to restore this important tourist destination in sync with the National Parks and Wildlife Service restoring the walking track.

At the request of National Parks, traffic controllers will be mobilised to Mount Warning Road this week to stop pedestrians walking through the roadwork sites to get to the National Park.

Also this week, Council will continue to retrieve materials from the washedaway Byrrill Creek bridge to rebuild a temporary one-lane timber bridge on the same alignment to restore more direct access for this community while assessing options for a permanent replacement bridge.

The temporary bridge will take at least one month to build so residents are advised that they will have to continue travelling via Tyalgum, or Cadell and Kyogle roads until then.

While roads are now trafficable, many are not in good condition and motorists should drive expecting multiple hazards.

Not only are some of the landslips still moving but road edges are soft and temporary patching of road scours and potholes may deteriorate quickly. Council expects it will take several weeks to clear topside slips.

Motorists also are advised to expect gravel and stone deposits on roads and to avoid hitting this type of debris at speed.

Over the past two weeks, Council has worked beyond its normal road maintenance limits to clear property access routes through road reserves. However, it cannot clear access routes on private property and owners are advised to contact the Recovery Centre by telephoning (02) 6670 2133 for advice on what options they may have.

Council's engaging honour

Council's organisation-wide approach to community engagement has been honoured with a major state award. Council's Community Engagement Network was named the winner of the 'Excellence in Innovative Leadership and Management' category at the NSW Local Government Professionals state awards in Sydney recently.

The Community Engagement Network or CEN is a group of more than 20 Council employees, from across office and field-based roles, who take part in a range of community engagement activities and aim to build relationships between Council and local residents.

Council's Director of Corporate Services, Liz Collyer said the award is an acknowledgement of the efforts of all the CEN team members.

"The Community Engagement Network represents a real shift in the way we seek input from Tweed residents about Council projects," she said.

"Over the past 18 months, our CEN members have been out and about at public events, markets and shopping centres and have had hundreds of conversations with community members on Council projects and initiatives.

"The best feedback we receive is that Council cares about what the community has to say and we are there to listen and have genuine conversations about how and why we do things, and what the community wants from its Council."

The Local Government Professionals award recognises innovative projects and the use of superior management and leadership skills to achieve outstanding benefits for the organisation and the community. Tweed Shire Council will now represent NSW at the National Local Government Professionals awards to be held in Hobart in late May.

Cobaki waste water plans on exhibition

Community members have until 24 May to make public submissions to the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART) regarding a proposed private waste water treatment plant to service the new Leda-Cobaki development.

Council has been advised that the proponent Leda has engaged Northern Water Solutions to provide water and wastewater services to the development at Cobaki. For Northern Water Solutions to provide these services it needs to obtain a licence from the Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART).

IPART is the authority that will assess the proposed licence application. Similarly IPART is the authority that will assess any environmental impact assessments relating to the construction of a wastewater treatment plant

The proposed treatment plant, on the site of the golf driving range at No. 425 Piggabeen Road, Piggabeen, is a private scheme and Council is not involved with the assessment of the proposal. All submissions and any enquiries on the proposal will need to be addressed to IPART.
