Nullum Street drainage upgrade

Council this week began work to upgrade the stormwater drainage in Nullum Street, Murwillumbah.

The project will see the drainage from Wollumbin Street to Lavender Creek improved to eliminate current water ponding issues during wet weather and speed drainage to the creek and then to the Tweed River.


The project will be delivered in stages over several years.

Stage 1 will install bigger pipes in on the existing mains line and build a second main on the western side of the street between Condong Street and Lavender Creek.

After the drainage is installed, Council will construct new driveways, install kerb and gutter and reinstate the road pavement.

The first stage of the project is expected to be completed by the end of November.

Two-way traffic flow will be maintained under the direction of stop/slow flagmen. Motorists should expect some delays.

Kids need a hand at the bus stop

The bus is a great way for children to get to and from school and for parents and carers to avoid congested school zones.

The best way to reduce any risk they may face at the bus stop is to meet them at the stop – never on the opposite side of the road.

Remember.

- Supervise your child very closely, holding their hand when crossing the road, until they are at least 10 years old.
- Wait until the bus has gone and then use a safe place to cross the road
- If you cannot be with your child, organise for a trusted adult to take your place.

Your primary-aged child is still developing an understanding of danger and safety. While they are often keen to do things for themselves, a live traffic environment is not a safe place for this independent learning. Always ensure a responsible adult is with your child when they are around moving vehicles.

Children are still developing the skills they need to judge the direction of sound and the speed and distance of vehicles.

Your child is physically small, making it harder for drivers to see them. They tend to only be able to focus on one thing at a time, so can be easily distracted. This means that they find it difficult to deal with sudden changes in the traffic environment.

All motorists are reminded that buses use signs and flashing lights to warn drivers that they are picking up and dropping off children. You must slow down to 40km/h when bus lights flash and look out for children crossing the road.

Be Bus Aware and help keep our kids safe.

Safer roads funding received

Council has received NSW Government Safer Roads Program funding of \$371,486 to improve two sections of Tweed Valley Way:

- · a 500m length near Minnie Perkins Road, Fernvale
- a 700m length of Tweed Valley Way north of Harwood Road, Burringbar

The funding will be used to install high-friction, skid-resistant surfaces and vehicle-activated signs that flash 'Slow Down' when cars are travelling too fast.

The flashing signs will be set to lower speeds in the wet, encouraging motorists to drive to the road conditions.

These projects are targeting sites where there have been a number of wet road crashes in which speed has been identified as a contributing factor.

The Safer Roads Program is a key initiative of the NSW Road Safety Strategy, which aims to make state roads safer and reduce crashes on the road network.

This program funds low-cost engineering treatments and other improvements where there are clusters of casualty crashes on local and regional roads.

Work begins this week to extend the beach access ramp south of Cudgen Headland Surf Life Saving Club.

The ramp will be lengthened by 15 metres to improve beach access during erosion events (such as the erosion pictured right).

"The beach end of the ramp will be around 1.5 metres lower, to help maintain safe access when sand levels are low," Kingscliff Foreshore Revitalisation Project Manager Stewart Brawley said.

"This improvement will really complement the foreshore revitalisation north of the surf club, with the new concrete steps and rock wall nearing completion. "While the new steps will be a great link between the beach and the new Kingscliff Central Park, the ramp is an important access for the surf club crews and other beach users."

The ramp extension is expected to take three to four weeks to complete, in time for the start of this summer's beach patrol season.


