Get in touch with Council about private memorials

Council is occasionally approached by friends or relatives of deceased persons who wish to commemorate them by installing a plaque or memorial in a public area.

Whilst Council sympathises with the loss, and understands the desire to remember people at places of significance to them, it is not felt appropriate to have numerous individual memorials placed throughout public reserves and parks, particularly popular areas with significant natural and scenic values.

Council's Coordinator of Natural Resource Management Jane Lofthouse said the placement of memorials in public places must be approved by Council to ensure that they do not impact on others' enjoyment of our natural areas and parks.

"Although it's a sensitive issue, these memorials need to be removed to preserve the character of natural areas and to ensure these spaces

are well-maintained for all to enjoy," said Ms Lofthouse.

The Private Memorials in Public Parks and Natural Areas Policy was on exhibition in 2018 and four submissions were received. Council adopted this policy in November 2018 and as per the policy, Council will remove existing, unapproved memorials. Council will commence removals in June 2019.

There are a number of plaques attached to, and memorials painted on rocks located on the Tweed Coast, predominantly at Hastings Point. In most cases Council cannot identify and contact family members who have established these memorials. If people who have installed memorials in public areas wish to remove them prior to Council doing so, they should arrange this over the next month. Any memorials that are removed will be held at Council for a period of time.

New penalties from 20 May

From next week, motorists caught with a low-range blood-alcohol concentration while behind the wheel will immediately lose their licence for three months and be fined \$561.

This applies to all offenders, including first time offenders.

The same will apply to anyone caught driving with an illicit substance in their blood stream.

Last chance to have your say on fees and charges

The waste industry is undergoing significant change and has been subject to major shocks in the international market for recyclables over the past 12 months.

These changes are increasing the cost of processing recyclables globally.

In accordance with the *Local Government Act 1993*, councils must recover all costs associated with waste management services. Unfortunately this means our waste fees and charges, as part of Council rates, will need to increase because:

- the NSW Government applies a levy to waste that is landfilled in NSW and this levy is continuing to increase
- the Queensland Government is introducing a new waste levy in the next financial year
- there continues to be contamination in yellow and green bins across the Tweed with incorrect items being placed in these bins which is adding to Council's waste costs.

Counting cockatoos for conservation

Calling all bird lovers! It's time again for the annual Glossy Black-Cockatoo Birding Day set for Sunday 19 May.

The birding day is an initiative supported by the Glossy Black Conservancy and Council, and aims to learn more about the distribution, habitat use and population numbers of the threatened glossy black-cockatoo.

Glossy black-cockatoos are the smallest of the black cockatoos, have red panels on their tail feathers and do not have the prominent crests seen in other species.

Candidates reminded of signage rules in run-up to election

With the federal election taking place on Saturday (18 May), candidates and their supporters are reminded they must comply with State and Council regulations when erecting signage.

Council officers continue to undertake a program of compliance and monitoring, and an additional Ranger will be inspecting voting sites and other public areas on election day.

All posters and signage containing electoral material must comply

with the *State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) 2008* Division 2, Subdivision 13 – Election signs.

As part of these regulations, no signs are allowed in Council's road reserves, either free-standing pole signs or those affixed to trees or street furniture.

Signage is also not allowed to be displayed on a trailer parked on a road or road-related area.

Free workshop for motorcyclists to 'Survive the Ride'

Motorcyclists are invited to attend a free workshop to 'Survive the Ride' in the Tweed.

Council is again hosting this two and half-hour workshop as part of the Local Government's Road Safety Program, which aims to promote safer driving and reduce road trauma.

"As riders, we know how much enjoyment you can get out of riding," Survive the Ride Association of NSW's David Tynan said.

"We also know there's something to be learned on every ride.

"One way we learn is to notice our little mistakes and try to avoid them next time," Mr Tynan said.

"Another, less risky way, is to learn how to avoid mistakes from other riders. In this workshop we will talk openly about the mistakes we make and how to avoid them.'

The workshop is presented by Survive the Ride Association instructors. including former highway patrol officers, and will be held at the South Sea Islander Room at the Tweed Heads Administration Building, Brett Street, Tweed Heads, on Saturday 25 May from 12 to 2.30pm.

Participants will learn how to make better decisions and improve their roadcraft skills and riding techniques to reduce the risks of the ride, potential medical expenses, repair bills and traffic fines.

"We'll also focus on the issues most riders are interested in, such as good cornering, which is much more than enter wide, stay wide and exit close, and how to reduce aches and pains through improved posture," Mr Tynan said.
