# Road network suffers more damage

Residents are urged to exercise patience and drive to conditions as Council once again takes stock of the damage to the Tweed's road network following the second flooding event in 4 weeks.

More than 1,900 road repair jobs at an estimated cost of more than \$40 million were logged in the system following the rain event of 28 February, with that figure likely to rise in coming days as road crews assess the Tweed's roads following this week's flooding rains.

Already, several new issues have been recorded, including at Tweed Valley Way between the Tumbulgum intersections where damage to the road surface from the first flood has worsened, forcing its closure in both directions. Tweed Valley Way is also closed at other points due to floodwater (at time of going to print), including at Oaks Avenue. Detours are in place where possible.

Dozens of additional road closures and cautions are in place across the Tweed, with their status updated at MyRoadInfo northernrivers.myroadinfo.com.au

Major landslips at Scenic Drive in Bilambil, Reserve Creek Road and Tyalgum Road, which occurred during the first flooding event, remain perilous and may be further damaged. Motorists are urged not to move road closure barriers as these are in place to save lives.

Emergency works in response to this most recent flood event have commenced and will entail repair of damage to Tweed Valley Way at Tumbulgum, removal of mud from this road and Dulguigan Road, removal of landslips and repair of washouts on Byrrill Creek Road and many other rural roads. Additional landslips also occurred on Monday night on Tomewin Road and Balfours Road, Bungalora.

Council asks the community for patience as its crews work to fix the road network.

Our roads have suffered incredible damage - especially in our hinterland areas - and it will take many months or even years to get back to where we were before the flood.

Please don't be that person who abuses workers who are doing everything they can to safely respond to high priority road hazards caused by the latest downpour.

Council's first priority is always to respond to residents in lifethreatening situations and the worst hit areas. We target our busiest roads first and any areas where people may be isolated. After that, we will move to other areas of the Tweed.

While it may take some time to get around to areas of less significant damage, we will get there. Sometimes repairs to problems like potholes will be temporary in nature to make roads passable until more permanent repairs can be done.

Motorists are urged to:

- Avoid unnecessary travel during wet weather even a small rain event has the potential to make already flood-damaged roads unstable and roads that have previously been cleared of mud, trees and other flood debris may also become hazardous as rain washes over them.
- Remain cautious on our roads, especially during and immediately after wet weather.
- Slow down, the posted speed limit is the maximum speed under ideal conditions but when it's wet a slower speed is safer.
- · Be patient as crews continue with the clean-up. While roadworks might slow you down in the short term, they will get us all moving more quickly and safely once works are complete.
- Plan for delays and give yourself more travel time to get to vour destination.
- · Be kind to others on the road.

# Scenic Drive geotechnical investigations go ahead

Scenic Drive landslip geotechnical investigations planned for Thursday 31 March and Friday 1 April between Mount Bilinga Circuit and Warringa Drive will go ahead at this stage.

A reminder to residents in Mount Bilinga Circuit and the section of Scenic Drive between the 2 slips: this section of Scenic Drive will be closed from 10 am to 1 pm on both days.

Fixing landslips is a complex engineering task. It is important that the base of the slip is properly stabilised to prevent a similar failure in the future. There are various specialist methods for doing this, and the option chosen needs to suit the site conditions, based on geotechnical assessment. Only then can the missing piece of road be constructed over this new foundation.

Thank you for your patience as we work towards more permanent repairs.

# **Events to tackle cane toad numbers**

To help rid the Tweed of this pest, join the next cane toad busting session on Tuesday 5 April from 5:30 pm at Kingscliff. The session will involve a quick and informative talk and community toad bust, with the aim of collecting as many toads from the environment as possible.

A cane toad tadpole trapping and information session will also be held at Banora Point on 12 April from 6 pm. This short session will teach participants about cane toads, tadpole

trapping and how get involved with the program to make a difference in the local environment.

#### **Expressions of interest**

#### Clean fill

# Council is calling for expressions of interest from landowners willing to accept clean fill from its construction projects.

Council would deliver the fill free of charge to the property if the trip is shorter than that to a Council disposal facility. If the trip is longer, the property owner would be charged a gap fee based on mileage.

Properties suited to accepting fill must be able to be accessed by a tandem truck. In wet weather, fill can only be delivered to properties with

all-weather access. If Council accepts a property as suitable, it will add the property to a

database and contact the applicant when clean fill becomes available from a nearly worksite.
