Leaving a legacy:

Looking out for future generations

We are protecting and managing the environment for current and future generations. Continued programs such as Tweed Toad Busters and Take the Lead pilot as well as protection measures for endangered Bush Stone-curlew; Conducted feral deer community workshops.

People, places and moving around:

We are creating a better place to live, work, visit, play and enjoy Held Australia Day and Seniors Festival Awards, Citizenship Ceremony; Launched 'Living Longer Living Stronger'; Expanded 'Why Leave Town' loyalty program; Celebrated Neighbour Day; Exhibitions: 'Liked & Shared' (Tweed Regional Museum) and 'An Artist's View' and 'A History of Forgetting' Tweed Regional Calleny)

We are building and maintaining an integrated, connected and accessible transport network. Commenced Tweed Coast Road upgrade and Dunbible Bridge restoration works; 11 scheduled road projects completed or underway. Logged more than 1,900 road repair jobs totalling a \$40m ofter February flood.

Making decisions with you:

We're in this together

We are regulating and delivering the built environment to better balance the community's social, cultural, economic and environmental needs. 156 DAs determined in this period, 246 DAs submitted in this period. Tweed Conservation Zone Review underway on Tweed Coast.



We are protecting people and property by managing the risk of flooding. Sought expressions of interest for expansion of Industrial Land Swap initiative. We are providing high quality and secure water, sewer, rubbish and recycling services. Received 7,900 tonnes of flood-related waste and 30,000 tonnes of clean fill from landslips and river mud; Completed sewer works in Wollumbin Street, Murwillumbah.

We are building healthy, safe and inclusive communities. Supported Community Recovery Centres in Murwillumbah and Chinderah; Launched Mayoral Flood Appeal; Community shared flood stories; Opened 2 inclusive play parks and 2 fenced off-leash dog parks.

We are providing opportunities for the public to inform Council decision making. Cr Cherry elected Mayor; Cr Byrnes Deputy Mayor; 6 items placed on public exhibition including draft Drought and Water Restriction Policy; Conducted Business Flood Impact Assessment Survey.
