There have been 10 confirmed sightings of feral deer in the Tweed in just a few months.

Feral deer are here – new sightings in the Tweed

Ten confirmed sightings of deer in the Tweed and 2 in the Kyogle region have been recorded since the Northern Rivers Feral Deer Alert program was launched in May.

Council's Feral Deer Management Officer Rachel Hughes said that in the past week, 2 sightings were reported in the Tweed at Bilambil Heights, one at Pottsville and one at Crabbes Creek near the Tweed Shire border

"These weren't just way out in the bush as people might think, they are moving in very close to residential areas," Ms Hughes said.

"We know people aren't out and about at the moment during the lockdown, however we really need your help if you do see a deer as this can get away from us if we don't act now - the deer won't wait for us." Ms Hughes said as a community, we need to be on high alert

because having feral deer in built-up areas comes with an increased risk of vehicle collisions, harassment of pets, animals and cattle and finding deer in backyards eating vegetable patches.

"The advice is not to approach the deer as they can get aggressive, especially in their mating season," she said.

This community awareness campaign aims to prevent feral deer numbers growing out of control in the region.

"We urge the community to report any sightings and take a photo or video if it's safe to do so. Receiving reports from the public is critical to prevent the deer situation from escalating," Ms Hughes said.

Taking the mystery out of technology for seniors

Feeling like technology is proving to be a barrier to staying in touch or going about your daily life? At the moment, the need for these skills is highlighted by the importance of accessing health information.

Council – with the support of the Australian Government Department of Health – is conducting a program which will help take the 'mystery' out of technology, helping participants learn skill to shop, pay bills and stay in touch with family and friends online.

If COVID-19 restrictions at the time allow, the Shop Don't Drop program will run from Monday 6 September for 12 weeks until Monday 29 November from 9 to 11:30 am in a friendly, COVID-Safe environment at the Tweed Heads South Community Centre in Heffron Street.

Learn how to set up an iPad, take photos and store them and use a

calendar app to plan ahead for activities or appointments.

There will also be instruction on online safety procedures and how to use the numerous online apps, including social media to make life easier and more informative.

Morning tea will be provided and participants will have the option of purchasing an iPad – terms and conditions will apply.

Program coordinator Lyn Porter said the program was designed to assist seniors gain knowledge and confidence in using an iPad in a supportive fashion.

The cost is \$5 each week or \$30 for the 12 week program, which is a saving of 50%.
